<u>RE: Wind-down of Canadian Blood Services Interim COVID-19 Initiative - Home</u> <u>Delivery of Plasma Protein and Related Products</u>

Dear Hospital Colleagues,

In May 2020, Canadian Blood Services gave hospitals access, at no charge, to a courier service to deliver plasma protein and related products directly to patients' homes who were immunocompromised and at higher risk of infection of COVID-19.

The Ministry of Health ("ministry") on advisement of the Ontario Emergency Blood Management Committee (OEBMC) supported Canadian Blood Services' interim initiative and in May 2020 sent a letter to hospitals about the interim initiative.

On behalf of the ministry, I would like to thank hospitals that have participated in the Program, as it ensured high-risk patients continued to receive their treatments during the COVID-19 pandemic. I would also like to thank hospitals that put their own measures in place to ensure patients continued to receive their treatments during the COVID-19 pandemic.

With the lower rates of COVID-19 and high vaccination rates, the ministry is transitioning to normalized health care operations. As part of this transition, the Canadian Blood Services interim initiative will wind-down effective March 1, 2024. In the interim the services of the courier company will continue to be made available to hospitals that are participating in the initiative.

The ministry requests that hospitals inform any impacted patients of the upcoming changes and hospital transfusion services discuss alternate plans with patients.
